You will be thrilled and excited by the herpetologists from Rainforest Reptiles who will give you every fact and dispel your misconceptions about the rainforest and the reptiles that live there.

Co-founders Joaney M. Gallagher and Michael K. Ralbovsky of Rainforest Reptile Shows have over 200 exotic reptiles. Their animals are the stars in an interactive show for all ages.

Join three awesome teen volunteers for some fun stories outdoors on the library lawn!



This show will be outdoors on the library lawn.



OUTDOOR STORYTIMES

Mother Goose on the Loose Storytime Ages 0 – 2 and up

Mondays and Thursdays at 10:30 (no storytime on October 11)

Mother Goose on the Loose is an early literacy program that uses rhymes and songs to help prereading children get ready for reading. It incorporates music, movement, ritual, repetition, positive reinforcement, developmental tips, nursery rhymes, puppets, musical instruments, colored scarves, and book reading into a fun-filled 30 minute session for infants to 2-year-olds and their caregivers (older siblings are also welcome).

Storytime for 2's & 3's Ages 2 & 3

Wednesdays at 10:30 AM

This 20 to 30 minute theme-based storytime includes songs, simple stories, feltboard stories, and fingerplays appropriate for children aged 2 & 3 years old and their caregivers (older siblings are also welcome).

Stories for 4's & 5's Ages 4 & 5 and up

Mondays at 1:30 PM

(no storytime on October 11)

This 30 minute program, appropriate for children ages 4 to 7 and their caregivers, features a few longer, more complex picturebook stories and some fun fingerplays and songs.

(Older siblings are also welcome.)
