#### Virtual Mindfulness & Meditation Workshop

## Every Monday in February from 12:00-12:30pm via Zoom

Participants are invited to settle into a quiet, comfortable space and join mindfulness teacher Lauren from Bright Heart Coaching for a calming, mid-day meditation break each Monday in February.

These virtual Zoom sessions will be held on **February 2, 9, 16,** and **23** from **12:00–12:30pm**. Attendance at all sessions is not required. Register once and attend as many sessions as you would like.

In each 30-minute class, you'll practice clearing your mind, staying present, and easing stress through simple mindfulness and meditation techniques. You'll also learn how to bring mindfulness into your daily life. Each session will introduce and guide you through a different style of meditation.




## Museum Passes


A heart racing story about a mysterious town, missing people and a young woman trying to keep history from repeating itself.

A thought provoking mystery about a girl charged for murder because of her upbringing and where she lives.

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
