#### **Badges**

As you enter your reading time and complete activities in Beanstack, you will earn **virtual badges!** Look on the "Earned Badges" tab of your account to see how many you have earned!

#### **Prizes**

We have streamlined prizes for this summer!

At **10 hours of reading**, you will earn a **Prize Bag** that can be picked up curbside.

At **20 hours of reading**, you will earn an awesome giant lawn **Pinwheel** that can be picked up curbside! Plant your Pinwheel in your front yard so that everyone in town will know that you are a fabulous reader!

At **30 hours of reading**, you will earn a **Bookplate** that will be placed in a library book, with your name and the total number of hours that you spent reading over the summer! Make a reading goal for yourself! Aim high! (Bookplate redemption takes place in September.)

#### **Certificates**

At certain hour markers in your reading log, you will earn **Certificates!** Beanstack will give you the links for these printable certificates.

#### Raffle Drawings

As you read and do activities in Beanstack, you will earn **Tickets**. There are 12 very cool figures that are going to be raffled off at the end of the summer (lots of dragons, a couple of unicorns, and some other fantastical beasts). For these summer virtual book group meetings, each book group member will choose a book to read on their own, and then share their thoughts about their book with the group when we meet.

Meetings take place via Zoom; Zoom links will be sent to book group members the day prior to their group meeting.

## Virtual Version: Mother Goose on the Loose Storytime Ages 0 – 2 and up

Mondays & Thursdays at 10:30 AM through August 13

Mother Goose on the Loose is an early literacy program that uses rhymes and songs to help pre-reading children get ready for reading. It incorporates music, movement, ritual, repetition, positive reinforcement, developmental tips, nursery rhymes, puppets, musical instruments, colored scarves, and book reading into a fun-filled 30 to 45 minute session for infants to 2-year-olds and caregivers (older siblings also welcome). There is a unique Zoom link for each meeting of the Mother Goose on the Loose storytime – these links are emailed to our storytime email list members the business day prior to each storytime meeting.

Virtual Version: Storytime for 2's & 3's Ages 2 & 3

Wednesdays at 10:30 AM through August 12

This 20 to 30 minute interactive theme-based storytime includes songs, simple stories, feltboard stories, creative dramatics, and fingerplays appropriate for children aged 2 & 3 years old.

There is a unique Zoom link for each meeting of the Storytime for 2's & 3's – these links are emailed to our storytime email list members the day prior to each storytime meeting.

Virtual Version: Stories for 4's & 5's Ages 4 & 5 and up

Mondays at 1:30 PM through August 10

This 30 minute program, appropriate for children ages 4 to 7, features a few longer, more complex picturebook stories and some fun fingerplays and songs. There is a unique Zoom link for each meeting of the Stories for 4's & 5's – these links are emailed to our storytime email list members the Friday prior to each storytime meeting.
